each other during disasters.

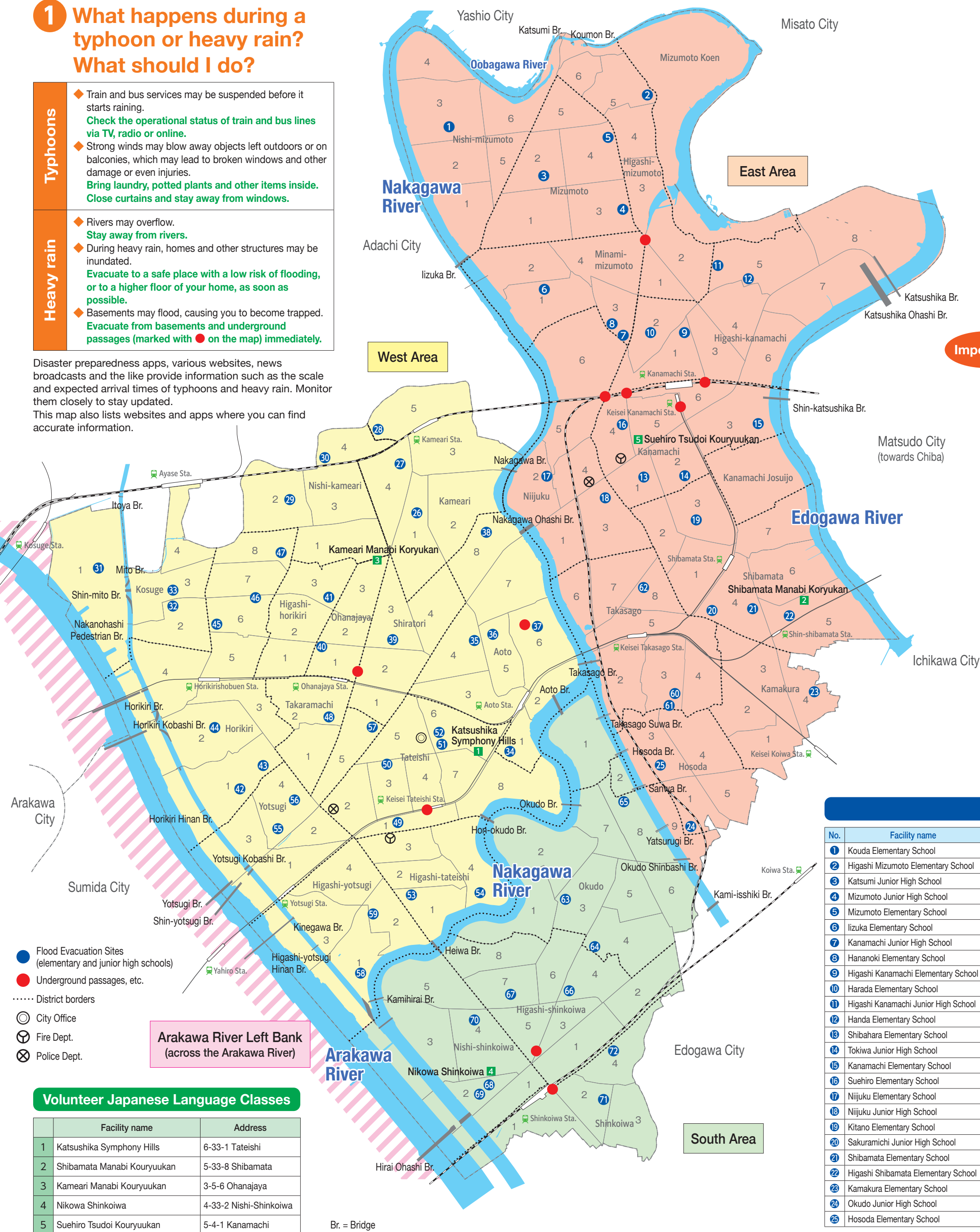
Act Sensibly During Typhoons and Heavy Rain

Typhoons and heavy rain are common in Japan, especially between summer and fall.
Since Katsushika City is surrounded by many rivers, you must take care and act sensibly during typhoons and heavy rain.

1 What happens during a typhoon or heavy rain? What should I do?

- | Typhoons | Heavy rain |

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Train and bus services may be suspended before it starts raining.
Check the operational status of train and bus lines via TV, radio or online. ◆ Strong winds may blow away objects left outdoors or on balconies, which may lead to broken windows and other damage or even injuries.
Bring laundry, potted plants and other items inside. Close curtains and stay away from windows. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◆ Rivers may overflow.
Stay away from rivers. ◆ During heavy rain, homes and other structures may be inundated.
Evacuate to a safe place with a low risk of flooding, or to a higher floor of your home, as soon as possible. ◆ Basements may flood, causing you to become trapped.
Evacuate from basements and underground passages (marked with ● on the map) immediately. |

Disaster preparedness apps, various websites, news broadcasts and the like provide information such as the scale and expected arrival times of typhoons and heavy rain. Monitor them closely to stay updated.
This map also lists websites and apps where you can find accurate information.



Important!

- Even in areas with a low risk of flooding, pay attention to the actual conditions and evacuate if necessary.
- If flooding occurs, evacuate to high ground or a safe location. Make sure the evacuation site is not at risk of flooding.
- If you remain in a flooded area, you may not be able to receive medical care or return to your normal life due to flood damage.

2 Where should I evacuate to if there is a flood?

The risk of flooding varies depending on the area, even within Katsushika City. Understanding the characteristics of your neighborhood and knowing which rivers have a high risk of flooding will help you identify which areas need to be evacuated.

In Katsushika City, outdoor speakers play music at 5 p.m. every day.
[Out of service/services temporarily suspended] 不通 / Futsuu; 運転を見合わせています / Unten o miawasete imasu

3 When do I evacuate?

When to evacuate depends on the announced warning level.
Katsushika City will broadcast warning levels 3 and 4 on its official disaster preparedness radio broadcast.
The information provided will also be available in Japanese, English, Chinese (simplified) and Korean on the Katsushika City website and on Katsu Rappa app.

Warning Level (when to evacuate)

Evacuate by level 4!

Level 5	Secure your own safety immediately	Level 5 indicates a life-threatening situation, and trying to evacuate to a distant location will only increase your risk. Instead, immediately evacuate to a high place within the building you are in, or to a tall, sturdy building nearby. You can also evacuate to an emergency evacuation building.
Level 4	Evacuation order	Evacuate immediately to a safe area that will not be flooded. Try to evacuate to a location within the area noted in 2 above or other safe location before the warning reaches level 4. Do not go by car; evacuate on foot.
Level 3	Evacuation of senior citizens and others at risk	Those who need more time to evacuate—such as senior citizens, children and foreigners not familiar with Japanese or life in Japan—should begin evacuating at this level.
Levels 1 and 2	Warnings	Check your designated evacuation site on evacuation maps, etc.
